

FIBER UPDATE

This past summer EBTC had buried fiber optic cable from Quasqueton to three miles south of Walker. This project was completed around February 1st. It has replaced our 1980s era fiber on a redundant fiber ring that no longer meets specifications for today's huge internet demands. Our technicians are now installing fiber in the homes and businesses that are along that transport route.

EBTC's technician are also working hard to complete site surveys in the town of Quasqueton and Winthrop. The site survey is the first step in completing the 2023 project to bring fiber up to your home. During the site survey appointment, our tech will draw the outside of your property and anything underground that West Union Trenching would need to avoid when burying fiber up to your home. If you live in the town of Quasqueton or Winthrop and haven't completed a site survey, please call into the office to make an appointment.

MARCH RECIPE



l<u>ngredients</u>

6 oz strawberry Jell-O 2 cups boiling water 2 ½ cups salted pretzels ¼ cup granulated sugar 8 Tbsp unsalted butter 8 oz package cream cheese ½ cup granulated sugar 8 oz cool whip 1 lb fresh strawberries

Instructions

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Combine strawberry Jell-O 2 cups boiling water and stir until completely dissolved. Set aside to cool to room temperature.

Crush 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups pretzels in a sturdy Ziploc bag, using a rolling pin. In a medium sauce pan, melt 8 Tbsp butter then add $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar and stir. Mix in crushed pretzels. Transfer to a 13x9 glass casserole dish, pressing the pretzel mix evenly over the bottom and bake for 10 min at 350 degrees, then cool to room temp.

When pretzels have cooled, use an electric hand mixer to beat 8 oz cream cheese and ½ cup sugar on med/high speed until fluffy and white. Fold in 8 oz Cool Whip until no streaks of cream cheese remain. Spread mixture over cooled pretzels, spreading to the edges of the dish to create a tight seal. Refrigerate 30 min.

Hull and slice 1 lb strawberries then stir into your room temperature jello. Pour and spread strawberry jello mixture evenly over your cooled cream cheese layer and refrigerate until jello is set (2-4 hours).

Here are ways your household can qualify for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP): Based on your household income, if you or your child Peter or dependent participate in certain government assistance programs such as SNAP, Medicaid, WIC, or other programs. MANAGING YOUR HOME NETWORK

Interested in managing your home network? For a limited time EBTC is offer a free router upgrade with an EVO device that works as an extender. With these two devices you are able to manage your home network by downloading a free app on your smartphone. With this app you can monitor when and what devices connect to your home Wi-Fi. You are able to see if any device has a weak signal and much much more. The most improved feature with these devices is the WiFi strength. WiFi is anything that is connected with-out a wire. Your devices at home will be able to roam much farther and still
